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What will I learn?

There are 3 areas of study in Geography:

Physical Geography and Human Geography (UK and other countries around the world). Geographical applications which involves 2 fieldwork studies.

Within these topics, you will study:

- The Challenge of Natural Hazards e.g. earthquakes
- The Living World e.g. tropical rainforests
- Physical Landscapes in the UK e.g. coasts
- Urban Issues and Challenges e.g. Rio de Janeiro in Brazil
- The Economic World e.g. Nigeria
- The Challenges of Resource Management e.g. food, water and energy
- A fieldwork study on tourism and coasts

How will I be assessed?

There will be 3 final examinations.

Paper 1: Physical study (35%) - Living with the physical environment (1hr 30)

Paper 2: Human Study (35%) - Challenges in the human environment (1hr 30)

Paper 3: Geographical applications (30%) - Issue evaluation and geographical skills (1hr 30)
